DLSAU's GROW Unit receives gov't recognition







The Special Education Unit of the Basic Education Department received the Government Recognition from the Department of Education on 2 October 2014. This recognition is effective School Year 2014-2015.

The SpEd Unit is also known as GROW which means Giving and Rewarding Opportunities to Wonderful students. The other name is introduced this year to acknowledge the skills our differently-abled brothers and sisters can manifest without having to label them as SpEd. It also tells the community that the program has "grown" and fulfills the school's responsibility in accommodating each and every student regardless of his abilities, thus, the school's

being inclusive.

The Special Education Unit started in 2003 as a response to the increasing need of some children who were having a hard time being productive in the regular program. They only had 20 students during the time.

At present, the unit has 78 students enrolled in the Self-contained Integration, Mainstreaming, and Inclusion programs. Some children are also allowed to join the regular class to enable them to blend with other students and become independent.
