In the late 1950's THE FURROWS was the name of the official student publication of the Araneta Institute of Agriculture (AIA). This institution was first known as AIA when it started as an agricultural school in 1946.

The concept of THE FURROWS was adopted once more in 2002 when Gregorio Araneta University Foundation (GAUF) became a full-fledged member of the Lasallian Family; and henceforth, 'twas called the DE LA SALLE-ARANETA UNIVERSITY. Since the turnover up to school year 2005-2006, it became the official institutional newsletter.

Today, De La Salle Araneta University, now enriched with the heritage of Lasallian schools and a partnership with a 334-year old educational tradition that has its roots in Rheims, France, has recreated and revived THE FURROWS, as it informs its collaborators and stakeholders through its regular publication and dissemination.

MR. BANAGUAS RECEIVES P2.5M RESEARCH GRANT FROM PEAC

Mr. Glenn Banaguas, adviser of the Environmental and Climate Change Research Institute (ECCRI), was given a P2.5M research grant by the Private Education Assistance Committee (PEAC) for his research entitled "Creating Climate-Disaster Resiliency in the Philippine Educational System".

The main objective of the research project is to reduce the effects of natural and anthropogenic disasters and extreme events (i.e. climate change) on Philippine educational institutions.

The project will benefit schools devastated by Super Typhoon Yolanda in Region VIII, specifically those in Leyte. These schools are Holy Infant College, Western Leyte College, Sto. Niño College of Ormoc, STI College - Ormoc, Saint Peter's College of Ormoc, Saint Scholastica's College - Tacloban, Saint Paul School of Business & Law, Leyte College, ABE International College of Business and Economics - Tacloban City, Asian Development Foundation College, STI College - Tacloban, ACLC College - Tacloban City, and J. E. Mondejar Computer College.

Changwon National University—located in Changwon, is a public institution of higher education and is the home of South Korea's first graduate school of labor.


PASSING OF BR. CRISANTO MORENO, FSC
