Special Project in Focus: Veterinary Teaching Hospital

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital of De La Salle Araneta University serves as the Laboratory Facility of the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine students. It was built in 1977 through the donations of the American Veterinary Students Association, whose members were students of the then Araneta University Foundation. It was located near the University's Gate 5. Dr. Mariano Austria was the Veterinary Hospital Administrator since its inception until 1986. Succeeding Dr. Austria as Hospital Administrator was Dr. Jessie Torres who held the post from 1987 to 1993.

In 1994, the Veterinary Teaching Hospital transferred to the Ground Floor of the BRF Building across the University where it stayed under the care of Dr. Narcisa Ditan until 2002. After Dr. Ditan, Dr. Nenita Avenido took charge of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital until 2005, catering to the needs of the community, and serving as a learning facility at the same time.

In 2006, it transferred again to what was called then as the Sanchez Property, the present location of the DLSAU Mini-Hotel. In 2011, it moved to its current location near the main gate of the University.

It is a four-storey building which serves as the Laboratory Facilities of the College of Veterinary Medicine and the Veterinary Teaching Hospital. To further serve the students and the community, the construction of a new Veterinary Building started in late 2013 and is expected to be completed in August 2014. The Veterinary Teaching Hospital has been under the watch of Dr. Wenceslao Ortiz, Jr. since 2006.

The Veterinary Hospital offers consultancy, treatments, vaccination programs, deworming programs, whelping (delivery assistance) and other diagnostic and laboratory examinations.
